What a contrast between the landing at Jamestown as pictured in the school histories with which the children of the United States are familiar and that landing at Jamestown which it is proposed shall take place at Sewall's Point, now to become a suburb of Norfolk, under the plan and command of Admiral Harrington, U. S. N. on April 26th, 1907.

The marvelous change wrought within the comparatively brief period of three hundred years could in no way more clearly be shown than by a comparison of the pictures of the two landings at Jamestown. In the first a few figures representing a comparatively large percentage of the English colonists who numbered a little over one hundred.

In the second, aside from the monstrous company, which may be expected to welcome the landing party when they shall reach the shore, will be about twenty thousand men, bending to the oars and filling the picture with life and movement. It is a magnificent panorama this, which Admiral Harrington has conceived and will unfold.

Just such a sight as the great fleet of boats and the twenty thousand sailors shall present the world has never seen. The very suggestion of such an one is sufficient to fire the duller imagination. Then to think that from the meagre company which landed three hundred years ago, garbed in the flowing robes of that time, these twenty thousand uniformed men have sprung up.

That from that meagre company are descended a large proportion of the nearly one hundred millions of men, women and children who are the people of the United States now, who have created from the wilderness, sparsely peopled three hundred years ago by Indians, the majority of whom have vanished into shade, the most potential land of earth cannot be other than inspiring.

The Exposition Company would do less than their duty to their countrymen were they not to make widely known that there shall be seen here on the opening day of the exposition a sight which cannot fail to stir Americans as they have rarely been stirred and to arouse in them such pride in their country and their achievements as shall fill their hearts to the brim.

It is a fine thing, too, that the great republic is at peace with the world and that thousands from foreign shores shall witness with us that splendid triumph of that republican form of government under which this nation has grown to be what it is—none of the great lights of the world.—Norfolk Ledger Dispatch.

NORTH STATE NEWS.
Items of Interest From all Sections of the State.
 Salisbury is infested with burglars. Judge Pritchard is quoted as declaring for State prohibition. The graded school at Hickory has closed on account of scarlet fever. The shortest name for any post-office in the United States is A. in Person county, N. C.

B. F. Arrington, a respected citizen of Rocky Mount, died at his home on Rose Hill, after two months illness. A State laundrymen's association was organized at Raleigh with P. M. Cave, of Charlotte, president, and J. W. Morton, of Asheville, secretary and treasurer. The closing exercises of the medical department of the University will be held at Chapel Hill, May 9th. Dr. George W. Long, will deliver the address. It has developed that the shortage of Ticket Agent H. A. Leonard, of the Southern Railway, who skipped from Salisbury three weeks ago, aggregates \$1,350. Engrossing Clerk Norvell reports 1,535 acts and 37 resolutions ratified by the last session of the legislature, being almost 300 more than the number two years ago. There are now 1,180 rural delivery mail carriers in the State. Those on routes of standard length—24 miles—get \$60 a month. After July 1st they will get \$75 a month. The North Carolina Society Daughters of the Revolution will send a representative of the society to visit several places, where there are persons eligible and wishing to join the society. Mrs. Charlie Greer, of Watauga county, tied her baby in her chair before the fire and left it alone. When she returned the child had fallen in the fire and was burned to death. 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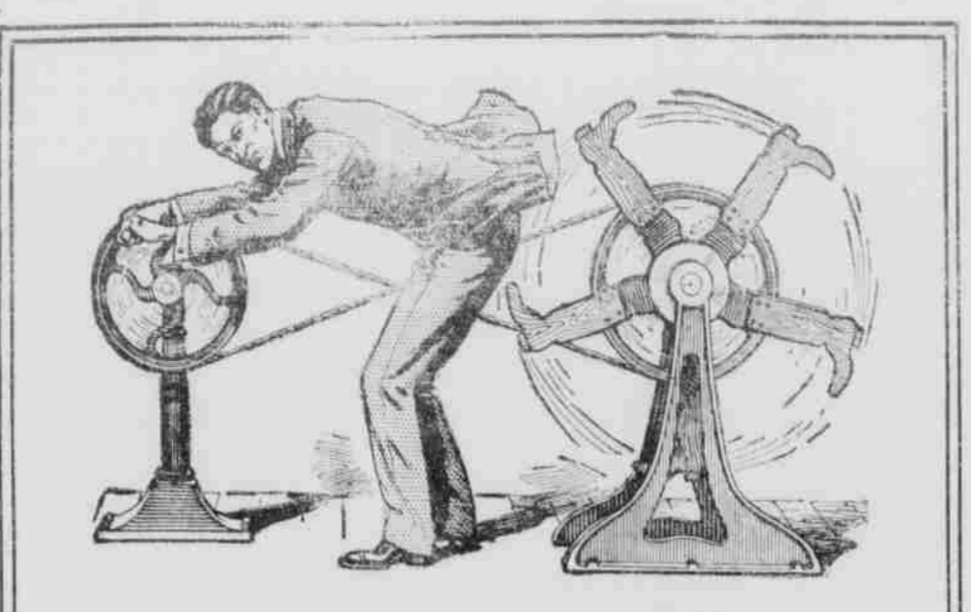
