North Carolina day, the big day of the week, is today and the old State which was "first at Bethel," etc., will be well represented. It is estimated that 75,000 North Carolinians will be at the Exposition today.

Gov. HOKE SMITH, of Georgia, has signed the prohibition bill which goes into effect January 1st next. We wonder if the Governor and the members of the Legislature who voted for the measure will keep their sideboards clear of well-filled decanters? It is strange almost hypocrisy that a large number of people who believe in prohibition for others fail to believe in it for themselves.

GEORGIA is beginning to rival Kansas as a State of "reds" and "fancies." A member of the Georgia legislature comes to the front with a bill having for its object the prohibition of matrimony and, as an inducement to young people to marry, he proposes to grant a free marriage license to all young men 21 years of age, but a graded license ranging from \$1.50 to \$5.00 is arranged for men between 21 and 60 years of age and over.

Mrs. FITZHUGH LEE, formerly of Norfolk, Va., has announced the engagement of her daughter, Virginia, to Lieutenant John Carter Montgomery, of the United States army.

Miss Lee is the youngest daughter of Mrs. Leonard and the late General Fitzhugh Lee, distinguished alike for his service in the Confederate Army and in the Army of the United States. General Lee was the first president of the Jamestown Exposition Company.

Mrs. A. NICHOLS, wife of a farmer near Germania, N. J., had a premonition several weeks ago of approaching death, and told her husband that she would not live until August.

The large bill rendered by the State of Georgia for champagne used on Georgia Day at the Exposition is being paid by the Georgia Commission and Governor Hoke Smith. Wine is politically most unpopular in Georgia. Last week and Governor Hoke Smith has refused to pay the bill which was sent by a New York wine firm.

A narrow frame of the matter is that the members of the commission will not admit any knowledge of the use of the champagne. President Mitchell says the wine was sent on approval, to be paid for if it was found good. As no one admits drinking the wine, it could not have been approved, and therefore it is argued that the New York firm has no claim on the State.
