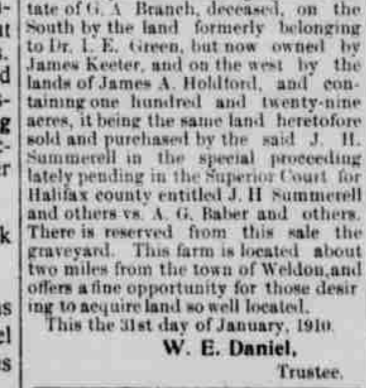
Monday, the 7th day of March,
