She is to be thanked for it, and to be applauded for setting so high an example to the women of the country.

THESE died in Geneva, November 1st, a man whose service to humanity must rank beside that of Florence Nightingale. He was Henri Dunant, founder of the Red Cross Society.

One summer afternoon half a century ago, Dunant stood on the battlefield of Solferino. In the smoke and blood about him he saw men writhing and heard their calls for help. But there was none to minister to them.

Instead of writing a poem of giving way to his own horror, Dunant went back into the world of politics and began working on a definite plan to put an end to such misery. He secured from a number of the leading nations of the earth a pledge to regard as neutral all sick and wounded soldiers, regardless of their flag, and also to treat as neutral all persons giving them succor.

Thus the way was opened for that beneficent institution called the Red Cross, which has done so much to soften the horrors of war and to uplift the ideals of nations.

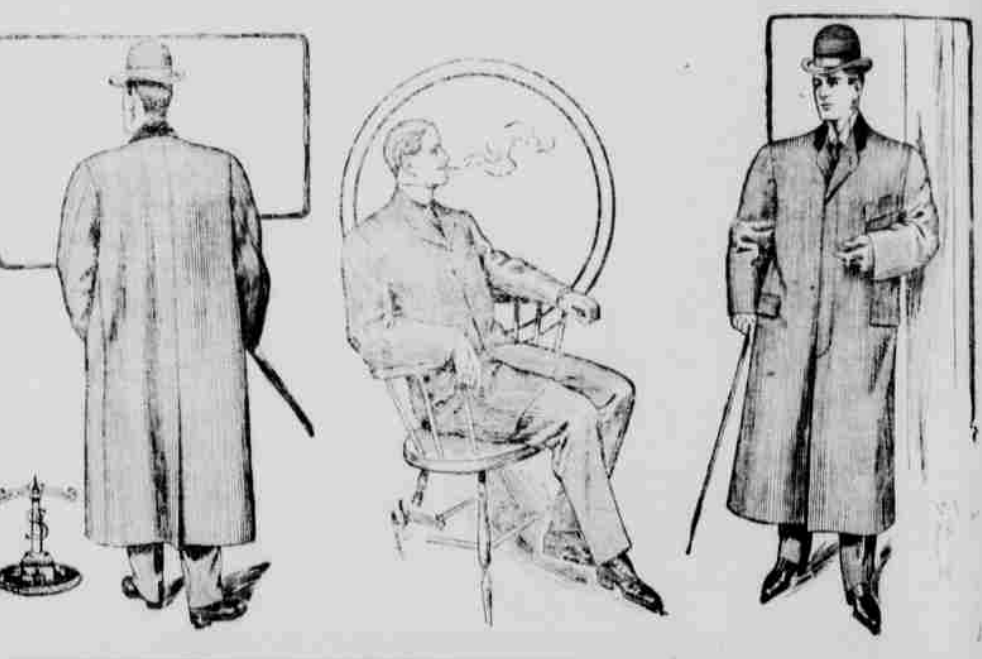
