M. J. NOLLEY DEAD.

Marcellus James Nolley, a Confederate veteran and for 35 years a traveling salesman for prominent Baltimore mercantile houses, died last week from heart failure.

Mr. Nolley was born at Clarksville, Virginia, January 17, 1843, and moved to Murfreesboro, N. C., in 1850, always claiming North Carolina as his home. At the age of 18 he entered the Thirty-First North Carolina Regiment, surrendering with General Johnston at Greensboro. After the war he went to Baltimore and entered the employ of a dry goods and notions store.

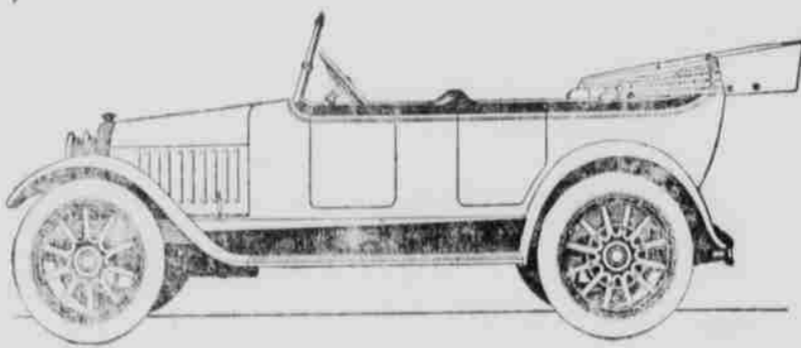

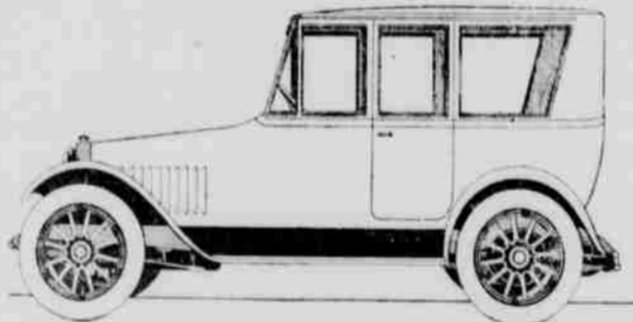
