SPEAKING at a public demonstration by the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks on Boston Common, Senator Lewis, of Illinois, declared that every dollar of America and every American had rallied to the colors in the war against German oppression. 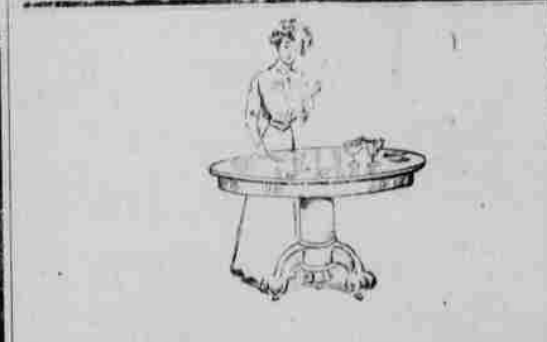
