Ralph B. Snead, youngest brother of Mrs. Raleigh T. Daniel, has visited Weldon several times. He entered the service of the United States on June 25, 1918, at Camp Lee and assigned to a Machine Gun Battalion. Sailed for overseas duty July 25, 1918. He was wounded in battle on September 28th, 1918 and died in Base Hospital No. 48 from the effects of wounds on November 1, 1918. RETURNED HOME. Corporal E. L. Travis, Jr., who has been attending the Central Officers' Artillery Training School at Camp Zachary Taylor, Louisville, Ky., after the cessation of hostilities resigned from the school and returned to his home in Halifax.

Prior to going to the Officers' school, Corporal Travis served two months in the 43rd Co. of the 156 Depot Brigade where he was made a corporal and where in the psychological examination for Camp Taylor he led 1500 applicants by 14 points.

Mr. Travis is a qualified lawyer. He passed the State Law Board last February, and graduated in Arts and Law at the University of North Carolina at commencement 1918, although he had been in camp one week. He will now enter upon the practice of his profession.
