BISCUITS, BUNS and ROLLS

Biscuits

3 cups flour
4 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup milk or half milk and half water

Sift together flour, baking powder and salt, add shortening and rub in very lightly; add liquid slowly, roll or pat on floured board to about one inch in thickness (handle as little as possible); cut with biscuit cutter. Bake in hot oven 15 to 20 minutes.

Royal Cinnamon Buns

2 1/2 cups flour
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
4 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup water
2 teaspoons cinnamon
4 tablespoons seeded raisins

Sift 2 1/2 tablespoons of measured sugar with flour, salt and baking powder; rub shortening in lightly; add beaten egg to water and add slowly. Roll out 1/2 inch

Parker House Rolls

4 cups flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup milk
2 tablespoons shortening
1/2 cup raisins

Sift flour, salt and baking powder together. Add milk and shortening to milk and roll slowly to dry dough. Roll out 1/2 inch thick. Roll in sugar and raisins. Cut with biscuit cutter. Bake in hot oven 15 to 20 minutes.
