





NATIONWIDE FIGHT AGAINST DISEASE

American Red Cross Will Have Health Centers in All Parts of United States.

The American Red Cross has faunch ed upon a nation wide campaign of fighting disease and polystical defect among the American people. A new and unique health institution has come into being as the result of several months study by the first Cross Realth Service Department at National Head-

Officials in charge of the departmen Officials in charge of the department predict that before long this new health activity will be in actual operation all over the country, and that the sign-"American Red Cross Health Center" will become as familiar to the peo-ple everywhere as are now the signs of the telegraph companies

Busy Long Before War.

The interest of the American Red Cross in the fight against discusse is not, however of revent origin. Long before the war the organization began this health survive through its medical units in discusser relief werk and its department of Tewn and County Nuis-ing. Furing the war and following the armistics their ands of American Red Cross officials have been fighting discuss in the war-stricker countries. At the same time tens of thousands of local Red Cross officials have been en-

bly during the influence epidemics. The American Fed Cross has de-termined that all this valuable experience in health arrive abroad and at home shall not go to waste. So long as there are a last a million people dying yearly to this country from pre-centable causes, and so long as more than one-third of the American stillalzes the argent need for continues Red Cross health service at home.

The Red Cross Health Center is of service to the sick in that it gives out reliable and complete information about existing citates, bosolitals, sam-toria and either institutions for the sick and the defective; about available nurses, both trained find practical; shout when to consult a physician and why to shun the quark and his nos-

Teaching Disease Prevention.
The Red Cross Health Center is however, of even greater service to the well. It teaches people how to provent sickness and discuss. This is don in many interesting and attractive ways first of all, by the distribution of popular health interature and through health lectures (linearated with through health rectures thin reached with lantern stides or with health motion picture films. Then special exhibits are given, one after the other, on various health subjects. Practical demonstra tions are made; also health singlets b children to interest and its runt then fives and their elders. Classes at erganized in personal hygiene, home care of the sick, first aid and in food selection and preparation Health clubs both for younger and older people, are formed; also Little Modiers' Leagues. Nutrition and growth clinics are conducted for children.

merual operation throughout the country. Many of them also conduct medical citates, but the one chief, outstanding feature of the American Red Cross Health Center is its health eduservice which teaches well people how to keep well.




