TO TAKE CENSUS OF ALL DISABLED

OCTOBER 30 THROUGH NOVEMBER 4 TO BE CRIPPLE CENSUS WEEK IN THIS STATE.

GOVERNOR APPEALS IN BEHALF OF CRIPPLES

Department of Vocational Rehabilitation and Bureau of Child Welfare Wish to Get Names of All Physically Handicapped Persons in N. C. in Order That They May Be Rehabilitated, or, if Children, Receive Treatment.

Enough—Every citizen should have his chance.

This is the basis upon which the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation and the Bureau of Child Welfare of the State Board of Public Welfare are proceeding in instituting Cripple Census Week which will be observed all over North Carolina from October 30 through November 4. The purpose of this state-wide census will be to obtain the names of all disabled persons, children and adults, in North Carolina who may be aided by training or treatment.

Governor Makes Appeal.

Governor Morrison has issued the following appeal to the people of North Carolina to aid these departments in taking this census.

It is the inalienable right of every one of God's creatures to have the opportunity to live his or her life as usefully and as happily as possible, and since every person has that right, we as citizens of a great and benevolent Commonwealth owe it to those who are physically incapacitated to do all within our power to either eliminate or alleviate their disabilities, to the fulfillment of the obligation, we will not only be of great service to the nameless and crippled but will serve our State.

In order that as many of such people as possible within the borders of our State may receive assistance that will aid them in rehabilitating themselves, I earnestly request the people of North Carolina to set aside the period of October 30 to November 4th inclusive as Cripple Census Week, and urge that during that time, especially all our citizens who may know of crippled persons notify officials of the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation and the Bureau of Child Welfare of the State Department of Public Welfare who have these matters to charge.

By thus taking a census of those of our people who are physically disabled or incapacitated because of some bodily impairment and whenever possible, securing treatment or vocational training for them, we will surely help to improve the usefulness and welfare of a portion of our population which merit the aid from those of us who are more fortunate.

Through a census the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation may enlarge its work in helping the handicapped man or woman help himself or herself, and the Bureau of Child Welfare may widen its service by ascertaining the number of crippled children who need treatment and by aiding them to receive it.

Your individual cooperation is cordially sought. I feel that this appeal will meet with sympathetic approval in seeking out the crippled of your community and giving their names to the superintendents of public welfare, superintendents of schools, health officers, nurses, farm and home demonstration agents, Red Cross and Y societies. You will help toward the rehabilitation of the unfortunate portion of our population and will increase the general welfare of North Carolina.

Those Eligible for Aid.

Those eligible for aid from the Vocational Rehabilitation Department are: All physically handicapped residents of North Carolina of any race and of either sex who are capable of being rendered fit to engage in an occupation and have lived in this state one year or more. The assistance offered to these is vocational training for a suitable occupation, aid in securing necessary artificial appliances and help in finding suitable work. Those who are not eligible are aged or infirm persons requiring permanent custodial care, epileptic or feeble-minded, and others not susceptible of rehabilitation.

All applicants under sixteen years of age will be referred to the Bureau of Child Welfare. Those eligible for treatment are provided for this Bureau. All children, white or colored, under sixteen years of age who are lame, have defects in speech or deafness or defects of vision, hearing or speech.

Special Agents Take Census.

The census of the State of North Carolina will be taken by the various special agents of the Department of Public Welfare, superintendents of schools, health officers and nurses, farm and home demonstration agents, Red Cross and Y societies. No return will be made to the State until the census has already been taken. All officials are requested to refer to some one of the agents the same address and nature of disability of any physically handicapped person who is thought will profit by training and, if a child, by treatment. At the end of the census week the names will forward these names to the station supervisor of Vocational Rehabilitation, who will refer for an answer either to the Vocational Rehabilitation Bureau or Child Welfare, the appropriate information in respect to the problems of North Carolina's disabled and gain.


