LONDON, April 2.—The Standard has the following from Constantinople "The Russians fearing that the Turks willendeavor to maintain neutrality, M. Onou, first dragoman of the Russian Embassy, has made the following demands, which may be regarded as an ultimatum : -- Abandonment to the Russians of the fortifications on bath sides of the Upper Bosphorus and Gallipoli and Boulair on the Dardanelles. The Turks are also to evacuate Makrikeni and Maslack and place some barracks and hospitals at the disposal of the Russians. The Grand Duke Nieholas last night urged these demands upon Reouf Pacha, and they will be submitted to the council. It is said that the Sultan and Velyk Pacha oppose them,"
