As the repeal of the bankrupt ac-
takes effect on the first of next montb, now little more than a week' distan

"A bankrupt is not required
pay any proportion of his debts co Iracted before January 1,1869 , n
any of those in which he is liable

that his assets shall be equal to thirt per centum of the claims-which his
oreditors shall go to the cost and tronble of proving in legal form
against his estate, and upon which sgains
sall be lisble as principal debtor, an

without assets can, however, be di charged by obtaining the assent
one-fourth ia namber and one-thi in value of their creditors who hav
