The Tally Ho stage coach was an interesting feature in the proces- sion. <u>Supposed Drowning.</u> This morning about half past five o'clock, Michael Horan, the watchman on Capt. A. D. Cazaux's New York steamer's wharf, saw a man walk past the entrance of the side gate to the yard where he watches, towards the river, and shortly theroafter heard a splash as though some one had fallen into the water. The faith- ful Mike immediately ran to the cap of the wharf to render any assistance if necessary that he could. But could dis- cover no one at all, though he states that he distinctly heard several groans. But in a very short space of time the groaning ceased and every thing was as silent as the grave. The watchman does not even know distinctly that the splash of water he heard was the noise occasioned by the man whom he saw pass his gate only a few minutes before falling into the river, but he thinks it more than probable that such was the case. This is all that is known in regard to the matter and Mr. Horan cannot tell whether the person was white or black. "Sea foam, indeed!
