A Tar Bill for Tar Heels.

The following is the bill passed at the recent session of the General Assembly, to regulate the sale of tar. We gather it in from the columns of the Raleigh Observer: The General 2 ssembly of North Carolina do enact :

pounds avoirdupois weight, shall be a barrel of tar. Sec. 2. That hereafter tar shall be sold by weight, at the rate of two hundred and and water during the r confineme eighty pounds to the barres, under the same rules that apply to turpentine as to excess of weight,

Sec. 3. That if any person shall sell or buy tar in any other manner than by weight, such person so offending shall pay five dollars to any person informing, to be reserved to the use of the person informing, before any Justice of the Peace hav ing jurisdiction of the place and contract, upon' written information supported by affidavit : Provided, it shall not apply where tar is sold in less quantity than one barrel. Sec. 4. That all laws in conflict with

this act are hereby repealed. Sec. 5. That this act shall be in force

from and after its ratification. Ratified 7th day of March, A. D. 1879.
