Petersburg Index-Appeal. ATTEMPTED SUICIDE.

A Chizen Weliberately Shoots Himself in Front of Jarratt's Hotel.

A little before 11 o'clock yesterday morning, Mr Spencer Webb attempted to comflat suicide by deliberately shooting himself through the heart. The ball from the pistol barely missed the Leart, but the wound it caused is of such a serious character that it is believed death will certainly result.

The following particulars of the affur have been obtained: A short while before the shooting occurred, Mr Webb sought to borre w from several persons in the besement of Jarrati's Hotel and elsewhere, a pistolflering to leave his watch as security for the safe return of the weapon. When questioned as to what he wanted with a pistol, he stated that he wanted to go out on the afternoon train to Reams' Station, on the Petersburg Railroad, to get a horse; that he would have to ride the horse back to the city late in the evening, and do not want to travel unarmed-not know mg what might befall him on the coun try roads. One gentleman, to whom he applied, rather laughed at the idea of borrowing a pistol for such a purpose, and told him that he need have no more fear nding from Reams' to the city of Petersburg by night, then of walking from Jarratt's Hotel to Market street at noon-day. Still intent, however, on getting a pistol, Webb went off and succeeded in borrowing one, but from whom, it is not known. The weapon he optained was a small four-barrelled, two-story pistol. He returned with it, and leaning his back against the trunk of the large Ailanthus tree in front of Jarrett's Hotel, placed the muzzle, as he thought, ever his heart, and fired. With the discharge he fell bleeding to the ground. The report of the pistol was heard by several persons in the vicinity who when they saw Webb lying on the ground, ran to his assistance. To one of these the wounded man handed a small piece of brown paper,
