Nine years ago he was a blanket Indian, and spent much of his time in the rural sports of his people, without a care for the morrow. Being naturally gifted with intelligence, he reasoned with himself (unsided by advice from others) that he had at least the intellectual advantages which would enable him to emulate the white man's ways in good habits, and accordingly pushed forward to reach that goal that would render himself and family comfortable and happy. 
