Made During the Night. There is a watermelon market on North C Street, near the city jail, where are stored at present about 600 melons. Tuis house does a wholesale and retail business. The sight of a big floor covered with 600 melons is something novel. Every night they are sprinkled with water to keep them cool.

Cariously enough every night these melons get up a collicky sort of a concert, which is worth listening to for once.
