Quite a large audience greeted the Mayor at his regular hour this morning. The first case called was David Mallett, colored, charged with being drunk and down. Sentenced to one day's impris-

The principal case on docket, which occupied the attention of the Court the rest of the forenoon, was then called:

The defendants being John Grady and George Hayes, members of the First Ward fire bucket company, (colore !), who were charged with assault and battery with a deadly weapon with intent to kill upon of John Tayler, person Saturday coloned. The barque Diana, (Nor) Roth, sailed | night during the alarm of fire on the West from Hull on the 28.h ult. for this port. side of the river. Mr. Solicitor Mcore appeared for the State, M. Bellamy, cleared at Boston on the 28th ult for this Esq., for defendant George Hayes, and John L. Holmes, Esq, for defendant John Grady. Numerous witnesses were called for the State, the defence having none. The first to take the stand was Dr. J. C. Walker, city and county physician, who testified that he had been called in to see John Taylor, a wounded man whom he found paralyzed, lying in an A runaway horse attached to a cart unconscious state and in a very critical condition from a wound in the head about one to one and a half inches long, which looked as though it had been made with a blunt jagged instrument. The skull he thought fractured, and he considered the recovery of the injured man exceedingly doubtful.

After Dr. Walker's testimony had been




