

A War Reminiscepse.

The sudden death of Gen Jeff C D.vis, at Chicago, brings to mind the tory of how he killed Gen William Velson, at the Gait House, in Louisville, m 1862. Bragg and Buell were fightig one another on the way here. where the provisions of the Federals aere stored. Gen Nelson was in comnaid of Louisville, and Gen Davis ed charge of the work in the inmenchments. At the close of the day. when Gen Davis reported to Gen when the number of men at work of the number of the numb hir service, he (Davis) was denounced and cursed for not having more. Davis replied that he had done his daty. Nelson, in a gruff manuer, seered him to report to Cincinnati and threatened that he would have the provost guard eject him from the Davis replied that he was a tieneral officer and should be treated

as a gentleman. Later, at the Galt House, as Gov Morton and Gen Nelson were standing near the office desk, both gentleme , having just left the breakfast table. tien Davis approached and asked Gov Morton to witness the conversation between himself and Gen Nelson. He demanded of Gan Nelson an apology for the rude treatment he had received the week before. Gen Nelson, being a little deaf, a ked him to speak louder, stating that he was hard of hearng. Devis again demanded an apol-

y. Nelson denounced him and supped him on the head. Davis step. and back and seemed to clinch his fist, and turned and segain addressed Gen Nelson, when Nelson slapped h m in the face and denounced him as a coward. Gen Davis turned away, remarking to Gen Nelson. that 'This is not the last of it.' He crossed the large ball at the Gatt House, and, meeting Capt T W Gibson, sked him if he had a weapon. ti bson banded Davis the pistol, without making any inquiry as to the use he wished to make of it. Gen Davis then crossed back to the point he had left, and met Gen Nelson as he came out of the ladies' parlor to go up stairs. Gen Davis told him to defend himself and almost immediately fired, the ball penetrating Gen Nelson's left breast, cutting the main artery above the heart. After being shot, Nelson turned and walked up stairs, and fell on the platform. He was taken into an adjoining room, and died in 15 or 20 minutes. Several surgeons were immediately called in, but the wound was fatal.
