

PRDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION OF TAXES DER THE CITY OF WILMINGTON FOR THE YEAR 1879.

Whereas the dilatory system heretofore pur ued by the City in the collection of its taxes has been the direct cause of a large accumulation of delinquent taxes, which have entailed upon the city an acditional burden of expense in the adjustment of the same therefore, be it Ordered, by the Mayor and Board of Al dermen of said City of Wilmington, and it is hereby ordered by the same. That the Treas-

arer and Collector be, and he is hereby required, under the penalties prescribed for non performance of duty, to make fell and complete returns, on the 15th day of March, 1880, for all and every amount charged to the several tax payers upon the tax books of 1879, which said several charges amount in the aggregate to \$-Ordered, further. That for the purpose of

carrying out the foregoing Ordinance, the Treasurer and Tax Collector is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to give legal notice, by advertisement at the Court House door and three other public places in the city of Wilmington, for thirty days, comneacing with January 15th, 1880, of all real estate taxes remaining upaid on that date On February 15th, 1880, the Treasurer and Tax Collector shall proceed to sell and dis pose of said real estate, in satisfaction of said taxes, Provided, however, that at least for days before such sale each delirquent shall be notified, by personal service of so much of said advertisement as relates to said real estate, and, Provided, further, that in every instance where a delinquent shall have su't cient personal property to satisfy his said taxes, his said personal property, wherever the same may be found in said city, shalite levied on, and, after ten days legal advortisement, sold in satisfaction of said tax be fore his said real estate shall be sold for sai

In all cases where poll or personal property taxes are due, the Treasurer and Tax Collector shall, after giving ten days' notice be-fore the first day of February, 1886, levy upon the personal property of such delinquent and sell the same as by law provided, to satisfy And the said Treasurer and Tax Collector, in his said settlement to be made on the 15th of March, 1880, shall not be allowed to show

the sale of any real estate or the return of any delinquent as insolvent, in said settle ment, unless he can show, by actual levy and return, that he has exhausted the personal property of such deliuquent real estate taxpayer before selling his said reas estate, and that he has exhausted the personal property of each delit quent poll or edrsonal property taxpayer before returning him as insolvent. Ordered, further, That interest, at the rate of 8 per cent. per annum, shall be charged and collected on all taxes remaining unpaid after the 1st of January, 1880.
Ordered, further, That all ordinances, or parts of orpinances, inconsistent with this or-

dinance, are hereby repealed.
