

A BOOM FOR GRANT.

The Pennsylvania Republican State Convention met at Harrisburg yesterday and by a vote of 133 to 113, instructe their delegates to cast their votes for Grant at the Chicago National Convention next June. Previous to the meeting of the convention it was thought that the influence of Senator Don Cameron, who has been Grant's ablest worker in the struggle, had been overcome, and that Blaine had much the best showing in that State for the race. It seems, however, that Blaine's friends have been most wofully mistaken, as, although they made a most determined fight and maesballed all their strength, they were completely routed. As the delegates were further instructed to vote as a unit, Blaine may as well consider his case hopeless in that State unless some unexpected and unforeseen circumstance should cccur to make it necessary for Don Cameron to change his views. The matter lies entirely with him and the Republican party of Pennsylvania are but subservient tools in his bands.


