On the eve of St. Valentine's Day it was the custom to have the names of a select number of one sex put into some vessel by an equal number of the other; and thereupon every oue drew a name which was, for the time being, called his or her valentine. The custom of choosing valentines existed very early. Presents of gloves, garters and jewelry were as common as valentines,


### The Lenten Season.

With yesterday the season of Lent oegan. The fast is of forty week days immediately preceding Easter.

The origin of the word L int seems to be somewhat uncertain. Some derive it from the Saxon lencten, implying spring, or the season when the days leugthen; others from the German word leinen, to thaw. As to the object of the fast, there has been some dispute, but it is generally regarded as a preparation for Easter, and a time specially set apart for repentance over the sins of the past year; while the number of 40 days devoted to it is thought to have reference to the Saviour's 40 days' fast in the wilderness, to the 40 days of the deluge, the 40 years wandering of the Jews, the 40 days granted to the Ninevites for repentance, or the time spent in fasting by Moses and Elias. The fast is also considered a memorial of the Saviour's passion.

Lent was held to have been instituted by the apostles, though Protestants generally hold that it was not established until the2d or 3d century, It seems to have been made obligatory at least as early as A. D. 250. its duration was first fixed at 36 days, and the other four were subsequently added. Tue first day of Lent is called Ash Wednesday, from a custom which yet prevails in the Roman Catuolic Church. Consinkling the head or forehoud mith

Short Loads of Wood.

We have heard many complaints made by citizens in regard to the short measure which is given in the purchase of wood. Of all the dray loads which are seen passing on the streets, not many will be found to contain a full quarter of a cord. Wood is charged for by the cord and when a man buys a load he pays for and expects to get a quarter of a cord And there is another way, too, in which the load falls short and that is in short sticks. A legal cord requires that the wood shall be four feet long and yet we have seen much of it sold here that would not average three and a half feet. We remark upon these things in the interest of our people in the hope that the authorities may find and apply a remedy.
