Postal Cards. old in this country, yet it is doing as well as could be expected for its age. It has only two enemies, the man who receives duns on it, and the manufacturers of writing paper. The little postal causes a bis pride, in adversity his solace, in pain secrease of from twe ve to fifteen millon dollars every year in the business of the writing paper trades in this country Pos tal cards are made at Hel use, and forty men are constantly employed at their manufacture. The cardboard is furnished in packages of 3,000 each, and every sheet is made into forly postals. Three presses are kept going night and day. A machine slits the sheets into strips of ten ca de each, and these in turn are bit into single cards and dumped in piles of twentyfive cards each, when they are packed by gi is in passagoard boxes containing 500 rards. A government officer is constantly on hand to see that no plifering of cards is done. The Holyoke manufactory turns out about a mill on of cards a day. Last year there were used in this country two bundred and torty-six millions sixty-three thousand and sixty cards.
