

Useful Measurements.

The number of square feet in an acre is 43.560. In order to have this area the piece of land must be of such a length and breadth that the two multiplied together will produce the above number. Thus, an acre of land might be 43,560 feet

long by one foot broad; 15,187 feet long by three feet broad, 7,594 feet long by six feet broad, and so on. If the acre of land is to be exactly square, each side must be as nearly as possible 208 feet 51
