The Cirolina Rice Mills.

Ground was broken this morning on the vacant lot. North side of Chestnut between Water and Front streets, for the erection of the new mi ls which Mesers. Norwood Gil s and Pembroke Jones have had in prejection and which they will style the Carolina Rice Mills. The new building is to be of brick, 40x45 feet, exclusive of the ergine room in the rear, which is to be 18 feet long, and will be four stories in height. Mr Jas F. Port has the contract for its erection and the brick w rk has been subjet by Mr. Post to Capt. R. S Rudeliffe. It is calculated that the unilding will be ready for deliv-

ery by the first of August. This millis to be erected on the plan of some of those which have been managed so successfully in Char eston during the past few years. It will be supplied with machinery of the most approved pattern, with all of the latest and most efficacious methods for cleaning and rolishing the rice, and with a capacity to run 600 bushels of rough rice per diem. The arrangements of the building will also te made with a view of putting in a sufficient Real estate, furniture and fixtures 38,858 31 motive power for a future capacity of 1,200 bushels a day.

Messrs. Giles & Jones will also fit up a two-story warehouse adjoining the mill, 26x60 feet, in which the rice will be stored and which will be supplied with the necessary elevators and other arrangements.
