'For several months the Western Union knew that wires were being tampered with, and they Fent for the Calcago detective. He traveled along tue line for several weeks, and finally came to a clue at a spot a few miles east of Battle Mountain. At this spot the wire had been cut, and a piece that could readily be disconnected had been let in. The detective further found an i sulated wire concealed in the grass and sage-tush near by. An end of it long enough to reach the main line was coiled up. The wire ran north, and the detective following it for a mile, came upon an excavation in the ground, which was roofed in with branches and turf, and which contained, buried in one corner, sev" eral Leyden jars, strips of copper and bittles of acid. The detective coudealed himself near by and watched the place for several days, but without TPBILL.
