Protection Against Heat-How to Prevent Prostration.

The intensely hot weather of July and August not unfrequently results in physical prostration, and somtimes actual sunstroke-not, however, to that extent that is reported in the large cities of the North. It may not, therefore, be without interest to many of our people to publish the following circular, issued by the New York Sanitary Commission as a matter of infor mation and precaution to those whose occupation keeps them much in the sun:

'Sunstroke is caused by excessive heat, and especially if the weather is 'muggy. It is more apt to occur on the second, third or fourth day of the heated term than on the first. Loss of sleep, worry, excite. for it is the anniversary o ment, close sleeping rooms, debility, abuse of that cruel prison how of stimulauts, predispose to it. It is more apt to attack those working in the sun, and especially between the hours of eleven o'clock in the morning and four o'clock in the afternoon. On hot days wear thin clothing. Avoid loss of sleep and all unnecessary fatigue. If working in doors, and where there is artificial heat-laundries, &:,-see that the room is well Bonaparte upon the thron ventilated. If working in the sun, wear a light hat, (not black, as it absorbs heat.) straw, &c, and put inside of it, on the head, a wet cloth or a large green leaf; frequently lift the hat from the head and see that the cloth is wet. Do not check perspiration, but drink what you need to keep it up as, perspiration prevents the body from being overheated. Have, whenever possible, an additional shade, as a thin umbrella, when walking, a canvas or feasting and almsgiving board cover when working in the sun? When much fatigued do not go to work. but be excused from work, espe ially after eleven o'clock in the morning on very hot days, if the work is in the sun. If a feeling of fatigue, dizziness, headache or exhaustion occurs, cease work immediately, lie down in a shady and cool place; apply cold cloths to and pour cold water over head and neck. If any one is over-

come by the heat send immediately for the nearest good physician. While waiting for the physician give the person cool drinks of water or cold black tea, or cold coffee if able to swallow. If the skin is hot or dry sponge with or pour cold water over the body and limbs and apply
