England Confronted with Two Rebel lions in South Africa.

LONDON, Dec 21-A despatch to the Times from Durbar says that a large torce of Boers occupied Hiedelberg on the 16th inst, and established a Government under Kruger. The inhabitants were forbidden to quit the town without a pass. The losses of the Basutos in their fight with the patrolling column

inflicted. The News in its leading article says: "The telegram from Pietermaritzburg discloses the fact that a state of war exists in the Transvaal, and that the resources of England are now apparently pledged to the task of subjugating the Dutch Boers. There are only 8,000 whites capable of bearing arms in the Transvasi, and of these 5,000 have ranged themselves under the banner of the republic at Heidelberg. We may dismiss as altogether uncorroborated the rumor of the defeat of the Burghers by the Pondos. The rebellion of the Boers can hardly fail to encourage the Basutos

to greater resistance." The Times, in a leading editorial article this morning. says: "Besides the dragging war in Basuto-land, to which the Colonial Government may have at any moment to confess itself unequal, we are now confronted with the danger of organized disaffection among the Boers. It is probable, however, that the appearance of British troops at Heidelberg will be followed by the dispersion of the Boers to their homes. The present garrison in the Transvasi is composed of two regiments of foot and a battalion of Rifles. At Natal there is a fine, trustworthy force of Natal Mounted Rifles. There are two troops of dragoons also at Natal. The Transvaal and Natal have also forces of artillery. We understand that Sir George Pomeroy Colley is advancing into the Transvaal with a force of artillery and infantry from Natal. We believe there is no reason to doubt that the Government of the Transvaal is provided with a sufficient force to encounter opposition. The Cape Government has not yet made any application for imperial troops."

London, Dec. 22 .-- A despatch from Durham to the Times reports that the Boers have stopped the down mails at Northern through and way Heidelberg and opened official letters. The whole Boer army is near Heidelberg. An action is reported to have occurred at Potchesftroom, but no particulars have been received. British troops have arrived at Standerton.
