Glass treated in this way is said not to crack even if exposed to very sudden changes of temperature. Chimueys are Eaid to become very dura. ble'by this process, which may also bo extended to crookery, stonoware, porece. lain, etc. The process is simply one of anneating and the slower the process, especially the cooling portion of it. the more effective wili be the werk. |
