The Appropriation Bill

Those who have pinned their faith on Senator Matt Ransom in the matter of the appropriation for the Cape Fear river and bar have not been disappointed. That distinguished gentleman has ever been a true friend of our city, as well of the State, and he has never yet omitted an opportunity to show his faith by his works. He is Chairman of the Senate Committee on Commerce and that Committee, through Senator Ransom, has just reported a bill which alters the aspect of affairs as regards the works here. Instead of the \$10,000 for the Cape Fear, as reported in the House, the amended bill reported by the Senate Committee gives \$140,000, and we think that the indications are good that it will pass in this shape The following is the amounts for North Carolina as reported by Senator Ransom's Committee:
