Postoffice News.

The Postmaster-General has issued an order under date of February 21, 1881 which revokes section No. 232 of the postal regulations. Under this section business, in stock and made to order. it was permitted to send all printed commercial paper filled out in writing, such as papers of legal procedure, deeds and the various documents of insurance companies.ctc, at third-class rates. Under the new order all partially written matter must be prepaid at the regular letter rate of three cents for each half ounce. The following exceptions to the rule are made: Corrected proofsheets and manuscript copy accompanying the same. Date and name of the addressee and of the sender of circulars, and the correction of mere typographical errors therein. Upon third-class matter, or upon the wrapper inclosing the same, the sender may write his own name and address with the word "from" above and precedmake simple marks, intended to desigwhich it is desired to call attention. There may be placed upon the cover or blank leaves of any book, or of any printed matter of the third-class, a manuscript dedication or inscription, but it must be confined to a simple address or consignment as a mark of re pect, and it must not partake of the nature of personal correspondence. Upon fourth-class matter, the sender may write his own name and address, precisely by the word 'from" and also the number and names of the articles inclosed. He may also mark the article for identification.
