There is complete stagnation in the Liverpool hog-production trade, in consequence of a report made by the British consul at Philadelphia that 700,000 hogs have died of cholera in Ohio. The Cincinnati Chamber of Commerce has sent a dispatch to Sir Edward Thornton, at Washington, denying the statement, and Wilmington, at Fifth Street, Ap'l 23-24 saying that the hogs in Ohio and the entire West have been singularly free from diseases of all kinds during the last year. The Chicago and Indianapolis Boards of Trade also denounce the false report propagated throughout Europe in regard to the American hog product. Commissioner of Agriculture Le Due telegraphs from Washington to the New York Prodace Exchange, that the hog cholera is not prevailing among American hogs to soything like the extent it did two years age, and that there is no special outbreak whatever in any State. He also telegraphed to Cincinnati that the story about hog cholera in Ohio is an absurd fabrication.


