Only for the Ladies

We are going to get up a corner in the court plaster market and our citizens generally need not be alarmed to hear of supposed gaping wounds on the faces of their female friends snugly covered by pieces of court plaster. The fellaming simple receipt for the remeand prevention of wrinkles will be the cause: Put pieces of court plaster on the face where the wrinkles are inclined to come, juut before going to bed and remeve in the morning. The plaster contracts the skin and prevents its sinking into creases and lines. Warm water should always be used to wash the face in, as it keeps off wrinkles.

Lemons as a System Renovator.
