Robbing the U. S. Mail—Fairly Caught.
Geo. W. Blaney, colored, who has for
some time past been employed as a mes-
senger at the Wilmington & Weldon and
Wilmington, Columbia & Augusta offices
in this city, was arrested yesterday on a
warrant issued by U. S. Commissioner
McQuigg, charged with robbing the
mails. A confederate, Sam Kornegay,
was also arrested during the afternoon
and jailed.

Blaney has entrusted with a key to
the large lock-box of the railroads at
the Postoffice and it has been among his
duties to take the mail from the box
each morning and deliver it at the rail-
road offices. Some short time since a
party in South Carolina wrote to Col.
Pope to know what an excursion train
would be furnished for. By some means
Blaney heard of this and he thereupon
wrote the party in Col. Pope's name,
signing that gentleman's name to the
letter, and stating that for \$400 the
train would be furnished. An envelope
was enclosed which Blaney had address-
ed to Col. Pope and on which he had
placed a certain mark by which he
would recognize it when it came into his
hands. The matter looked so suspicious
that the party to whom the letter was ad-
dressed placed the matter in the hands
of a railroad agent who forwarded the
letter and envelope to Col. Pope. A decoy
was thereupon arranged. The sum of
\$265, all of which, except one five dol-
lar bill, was counterfeit, was placed in
the marked envelope, duly mailed and as
duly received by Blaney, who was watch-
ed as he took the decoy letter, with
others, from the box. This occurred at
7 o'clock and at 11 Blaney was in jail.

At 10 o'clock this morning the case
was heard before Justice McQuigg, when
Blaney was moved to make a confession
which covers several pages of foolscap.
It will not avail him, however, as the
evidence against him without the con-
fession was conclusive. The prisoners
were both remanded to jail for trial at
the next term of the U. S. District Court.

Passport landed yesterday afternoon,
direct from the happy fishing grounds.

Magistrate's Court.
Magistrate's Row furnished only one
item to-day. That was a case tried by
Justice Gardner, in which Francis Met-
way was charged with forging the name
of Clark Hayne to an order upon which
he procured a lot of groceries from A.
Silva. He was found guilty and bound
over to the present term of the Criminal
Court in a justified bond of \$100, in de-
fault of which he was committed to jail.

**Accident on the River—A Boat with
Three Persons Capsized—One Per-
son Drowned.**
About 1 o'clock to-day a sharp squall
of wind, followed by a short but had
shower of rain, struck our city. No dam-
age was done on shore except the break-
ing down of a small tree here and there.
But the harbor was not so fortunate at
that time. Mr. Jas. O. Bowden and his
son, Mr. L. Tate Bowden, were crossing
the river at Point Peter in a small boat
to the turpentine distillery of the former
gentleman, which is situated just above
the Point. The boat was being rowed
by a young colored man named Tom
Howard, and an awning was spread to
protect the occupants from the rain.
When the squall came up, the boat was
immediately capsized and the occupants
thrown into the water.

The colored man, Tom Howard, imme-
diately struck off for the shore, which
was distant only from fifty to one hun-
dred yards, but before reaching it was
seen to sink beneath the water. The
younger Mr. Bowden staid by to assist
his father, although repeatedly urged by
the old gentleman that he was abundantly
able to take care of himself. He finally
left his father clinging to the over-
turned boat and struck out for the shore,
finally reaching a timber raft in an ex-
hausted condition. He was assisted to
land by parties on the shore who saw to
him at once and landed him safely.

Mr. Jas. O. Bowden clung to the boat
and finally unshipped the rudder, with
which he propelled himself and the boat
to the shore. He was able to walk home
when brought to the city side of the
river, but Mr. Tate Bowden was unable
to walk without assistance.

The drowned man, Tom Howard, was
about 25 years of age, and leaves, we
learn, a wife and one child to mourn him.
He was said to be an excellent swimmer
and surprise is manifested that he
should have been drowned.

There was but one case to-day before
Mayor Smith. Pot Hooks, sometimes
known as Edward McFarland, was
charged with drunkenness and disorderly
conduct. Judgment was suspended.
