Pender County Crops.

The report from the crops in Pender county is more gratifying than we had expected, in view of the long dry spell encountered early in August. Fortunately, the early corn had been made before the drouth was felt and has therefore suffered but little. This particular crop will yield more than an average while the late corn will not realize more about three-fourths of the acreage planted and the late corn about one-fourth. Cotton, we are sorry to say, will yield only about three-fourths of a crop, although this is much better than many

other sections will be able to show; peanuts will probably realize about threefourths and potatoes from two-thirds to

three-fourths.

Foul Play Suspected.
