Some Further Particulars of the Violent Storm of Yesterday.

Owing to our crippled condition yesterday, and the general demoralization which naturally prevailed, we were unable, in the limited time before us, to give more than a graphic outline of some of the most serious effects of the equinoctial which visited us then.

Opposite this office the large shed of the New York & Wilmington Steamship Line was almost completely carried away.

It was the Wilmington & Weldon freight warehouse, and not that of the W. C. & A. R. R. as stated by us yesterday, which was so seriously injured.
