



We notice in a Bristol (Va.) paper that at a meeting of the Bristol & North Carolina Narrow Gauge Railway Company, held October 26th, Gen. J. D. Imboden was elected President of that company. This road is to form part of the great line from the Ohio river to the Atlantic coast to be constructed by the South Atlantic Railway and Construction Company, which secured a charter last winter from the Legislature of this State.




