

The impertance of Vaccination.

The New York Board of Health in special circular in regard to the extreme importance of vaccination, says: "Vaccination is a public duty for the protec tion of the whole community, as well as of each individual and family, and it is so necessary to secure its protection in all places and for all classes of people that none have a right to neglect it for themselves, their families, the public schools, or the community. Every infant should be vaccinated before it is six months old, unless a good physician advises to the contrary. Every person who has passed the age of twelve years should be re vaccinated with fresh heiter virus, to test the fact of complete pro tection against small pox; and those who have had that disease should be vaccina. ted, as it may attack a person who was marked by it, as well as a person who has been only once vaccinated. For this purpose re vaccination is earnestly ad vised. Vaccination with lymph from clean and healty inoculated heifers causes no disease:"

Death of Mr. Isaac James.

We are very sorry to hear of the death of Mr. Isaac James, an old and prominent citizen of Pender county, which occurred very suddenly early yesterday morning. A friend in Pender county, a physician, who was on a professional visit to the neighborhood at the time, writes us as follows under date of yesterday, in regard to his death :

"I have just returned from a professional visit to Grant township. While there, I was informed, as I regret to write of the sudden death, very early this morning, of Mr. Isaac James, of that township. He had been complaining for two or three days of a bad cold and pain about his chest, but was able still to be up attending to his business. Last night he took medicine- was up very early and able to feed a favorite horse this morning-again went to bed and died about break of day. He had been in robust health, so much so that he seldom complained for the last year or two of a former chronic complaint of the breast. I met him about two weeks ago, and in our kind and pleasant chat he was congratulating himself on his fine health and vigor. He weighed then two hundred and twenty pounds, and was fifty-seven years of age.
