Mew Postal Rulings.

The Poste fice Department has ruled that the designation of the business or vocation of the party addressed on the address side of a postal card renders the card unmailable, when the place of busi-

ness is indicated in the direction. The following rulings of the Department in the January "Guide," this year, should be carefully considered by pub lishers, news agents, merchants, and ull others who send packages to the post office for transmission in the mails:

All scaled packages, except packages of seed in sealed transparent envelopes and packages sealed with internal revepue stamps; all packages sewed up, exence of any other matter est be ascertained by feeling; and all packages in any way so closed against inspection that their contents cannot be fully ascertained without breaking the seal, or without andre delay in opening the same, are subject to first-class postage-vis., three cents for each half cunce or fraction

The intent of the law is that packages of third and fourth-class matter should be so wrapped as to admit of their wrap pers being remeved, or the package epened, so that postmasters may discov er whether any letter or writing not permitted by law is suclosed therein. such examination earnet be made, the packages are subject to letter-postage. notwithstanding the fact that they may be open at the ends.


