Messrs Denham, Lang, Carly and Fitzgerald, respectively as *Lorenzo*, *Frederick*, *Rocco* and *Pippo*, were superb, and where each role was a specialty in dramatic art, it would be impossible to say which was the best. The choruses were well and efficiently rendered and the support throughout was all that could be wished. *La Mascotte* is certainly a charming comic opera, full of laughable scenes and situations, and Mr Ford may well feel proud that he has a troupe so able to give it a faithful presentation.

The audience were interested and delighted; and the ripple of good humor which seemed to be bubbling in the heart of every one, would frequently overflow in a broad and irrepressible stream of laughter as the actors aroused their mirth by some ludicrous or grotesque situation or expression. It was indeed an enjoyable performance, in which there was sentiment, mixed with nonsense, and in which there was fun without vulgarity.

The following is a correct list of officers to be elected in this State next November. There will be five ballot boxes at each voting place and the tickets will be placed in each box in this wise:

1. Members of Congress, to be voted for in each of the eight Congressional districts. The ninth member is to be voted for by the State at large, the name of this additional member heading the Congressional ticket in each district.

2. An Associate Justice of the Supreme Court; six Judges of the Superior Court, for the 1st, 2d, 3d, 4th, 5th and 6th judicial districts and Solicitors for all the judicial districts. Each district votes for its own Solicitor, but his name goes on the judicial ticket.

3. Members of the General Assembly.

4. Clerk Superior Court, County Treasurer, in counties having this office. Register of Deeds, Surveyor, Coroner and Sheriff.

5. Township Constables.
