It is intimated that important revelations may be expected should Senator Beck's resolution looking to an inquiry into the assessment business be passed. There is a Washington story to the effeet that Jay Hubbell has already notified the custodian of the assessment records to destroy them.

The cellars under the apartment houses on Seventh avenue, between Fifty-eighth and Fifty-ninth streets.
