DISASTER AT CINCINNATI.

Great Loss of Property and Probably Some Loss of Life.

CINCINNATI, Feb. 13.—The Ohio Valley from Pittsburg to Cairo is a vast scene of desolation. The water has reached a point never before attained, and the famous flood of 1832 is eclipsed.

The losses caused by this terrible visitation cannot be even approximated, and the amount of suffering entailed is incalculable.

The gas works are submerged, and last night the city was in total darkness save for the supernatural glare shed upon the gloomy scene by an occasional electrical light.

The city of Newport, just across the river, has suffered dreadfully. It is estimated that 260 acres of the thickly settled portion are under water.

Covington has not suffered so severely yet the damage there probably amounts to \$200,000. In many places the waters extend from the hills on the Kentucky shore to those on the Ohio side.

Mill Creek Valley, west of Cincinnati, is a vast sea. Here are situated several distilleries and many stockpens.

In this locality, on made ground, is also situated the depot of the Cincinnati Southern Railroad, directly over the very large McLean avenue sewer.

It is reported to night that the foundations of many submerged houses are giving way, and the buildings may be expected to fall when the waters recede.

Nearly all the gardens which supply Cincinnati are situated in Mill Creek Valley. They are all destroyed, and there will be a panic in the vegetable market.

Portions of the bridges leading to Covington and Newport are submerged, and the current in the river is so swift that no boats will attempt to cross and run the risk of collision with the bridge.

Only one railroad line into the city can be operated, the Cincinnati, Hamilton and Dayton, and a small portion of its track is under water.

The town of Lawrenceburg, Ind., twenty miles below here, is almost destroyed, and the loss will reach hundreds of thousands of dollars.

The water got into the glass works furnaces last night, and the fires are all out. The owners will lose at least \$100,000, and 3,000 persons are thrown out of employment.

The river is rising an inch and a quarter an hour. People are moving into the second stories of their houses.

The damage will be very heavy, but it cannot be estimated until the water goes down. Lawrenceburg is entirely covered. Some of the houses are submerged to the second story.
