THE BRAIDWOOD DISASTER.

Seventy Lives Lost by the Sudden Flooding of the Mine.

BRADWOOD, Ill., February 17.—This city is filled with mourning owing to yesterday's landslide, which resulted in the death of seventy persons. The place where the accident occurred was the northeast side of shaft No 2 of the Wilmington Coal Mining and Manufacturing Company's mine.

There was an air-shaft offering an additional avenue of escape, of which many availed themselves, but the water came in too rapidly to allow all to reach it.

STATE NEWS.

Charlotte Observer: Mr Wm. Neill, of Granite Hill, Iredell county, who was in the city yesterday, reports the loss by fire, on last Wednesday, of his dwelling house and kitchen. Most of the furniture was saved.

A great gold fever is raging in Polk county, and the yellow metal is being brought to the surface in great quantities.

A man of this city who returned from that county yesterday, brought along a handful of gold which he had bought while in that county.

Col Horace Kellogg, who in 1880 was general revenue agent for North and South Carolina, with headquarters at Charlotte, but who was transferred to California, arrived in the city yesterday after the absence of three years.
