There is made ex-pressly for her a light Hall condenser with 13,000 feet of nickel tubing. Her speed is calculated at twenty-five miles an hour. Mr. Jacob Lorillard, who inspected the vessel yesterday, said that there was no doubt she could do this if enough steam were got up.

The company has built 27 acres of land and 700 feet of water front at Bay Ridge for construction docks. It proposes to build steamers after this model for ocean travel that will carry 4,000 tons of freight, 600 first class passengers, 2,000 steerage passengers and 500 tons of mail and express matter :-The time between Liverpool and New York, it is calculated, would be five days.
