No vessel must leave the Qua: antine anchorage, or allow any person, steamer, tug boat, lighter, or boat of any kind to go alongside, unless by written authority from the Quarantire Physician, and every vessel must be an-chored as far to the castward of the channel

as is consistent with safety. Regulations governing vessels while in Quar-antine may be nad on application at the office of the Quarantine Physician at Smithville.
