OUR CONSUL AT CANTON.

The Honor of his Murder in an Outbreak there Not Yet Confirmed.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 7.—Up to 7 o'clock this evening the State Department had received no advices that an outbreak had occurred in Canton, or that United States Consul Seymour had been killed.
