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Report of the Condition of the First National Bank.

## The Good Samaritans.

We had expected a report of the proceedings of the Grand Lodge of Good Samaritans, now in session here, but it did not come to hand in time for this issue. There are a great many delegates here, all of the principal towns in the State being well represented. It is said that there are 250 delegates, representing 125 lodges.

## Peanut Crop.

Our good friend, Thomas J. Armstrong, Esq., of Pender county, who was in the city to-day, gives us a grain of comfort in regard to the crops. He says that while cotton and corn will stop short at one-half of a crop, peanuts will make a fair yield. As the cultivation of the "goober" is an item of importance in some parts of Pender county, this information is encouraging.

## The Association.

Steamer *John Dunsen* arrived here this morning from Still Bluff and carried up to-day more of those intending to be present at the Association now in session at Still Bluff. It is said that the attendance is very large, five counties, New Hanover, Pender, Bladen, Sampson and Duplin being especially well represented, although there are some present from other sections. The meeting will hold until Saturday and the proceedings are of much interest.

## Ashore.

The schooner *Loula Murchison*, well-known here, is ashore near Kitty Hawk. The signal station at that point reports, October 8th, that schooner *Loula Murchison*, from New York for Savannah, ashore near that place, lies about 75 yards from the beach, head on shore, with a little list to the starboard. She is leaking but a very little. She lies easy, in good position and condition, in about 5 feet of water. The sea was too rough for the salvage company to work. An anchor is placed in 20 fathoms of water, attached to the stern of the schooner by a 12-inch cable.

## The October Moon.

The October moon falls on the 16th at 2:01 o'clock in the morning. The new moon of the 1st passes near Venus and Mercury on the morning of the change. The full moon of the 16th is in close conjunction with Neptune on the 17th. On the 19th she is in conjunction with Saturn, passing 1 degree 13 minutes south. At some localities between 47 degrees south declination Saturn is occulted for the seventh time during the present year, but we are not fortunate enough in this latitude to be present at the show. On the 23rd the moon is at her nearest point to Jupiter and Mars, at nearly the same time. On the 29th she pays her respects to Mercury for the second time. On the 31st the second new moon of the month is near Venus. The phenomenon will be visible through the United States and on the Pacific ocean. The eclipse commences 1:14 A. M. The middle of the eclipse occurs at 2:10 A. M. The eclipse ends 3:06 A. M.

## Day of Atonement.

The greatest holiday in the Jewish ecclesiastical year, the day of atonement, or as it is called in Hebrew *Yom Hakippurim* begins at sunset to-day and ends at the same time to-morrow. Its name indicates its purpose. On this day Israel is to humble itself before the Lord by repenting of its sins in spiritual sackcloth and ashes, by praying, and by rigid fast. During the twenty-four hours of this great day not even a drop of water passes the lips of the orthodox. In the olden days the faithful remained in the synagogue all night and all day and were, for the most part, arrayed in a long, white, shroud-like garment, which symbolized the spiritual death from which, on account of their contrition and acts of penitence, the great Jehovah was to rescue them. One of the most beautiful and sublime parts of the service of the day is the recital of the prayers for the dead, and the *shofar* also sends forth its trumpet tones to awaken the people to a true sense of their digression from the ways of righteousness. The services in the synagogue here will partake of unusual interest, and the choral music will be marked by great solemnity. The places of business of all Israelites will remain closed to-morrow.

The annual meeting of the North Carolina Fruit Growers' Association will be held on Wednesday evening of Fair week in the Senate Chamber. The election of officers for the ensuing year will take place, and other matters of importance to the Association will be discussed.

## Sick But One Week.

A young German by the name of George Ohl, a nephew to John G. Wagner, Esq., formerly Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, and employed on one of the government dredge boats, was taken sick last Friday and went to the house of Mr. Wm. Martin, a member of the police force. He seemed to get worse and Mr. Martin endeavored to get his consent for summoning a physician. He could not be persuaded, however, and yesterday, as he seemed so much worse, a physician was called without his consent, but it was then too late, he died yesterday evening. It is said that he had a malarial attack and two congestive chills.
