SENATE.

WASHINGTON, January 24.—Mr Hale reported back favorably from the committee on Naval Affairs.

Mr. Jones, of Nev. reported back with an amendment from the committee on Contingent Expenses.

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. Mr. Young, of Tenn., from the committee on Public Buildings, reported a bill for the erection of a public building in Chattanooga.

Mr. Hewitt, of Ala., from the committee on Pensions, reported a bill granting pensions to survivors of the Mexican and other wars.

The House then went into committee of the Whole on the bill making appropriations for the payment of the rebate on the tax on tobacco.

On motion of Mr. Randall, of Pa., the House non-conferred in the Senate amendment to the bill providing for the relief of L. Greely and party.

Mr. Henley, of Cal., from the committee on Public Lands, reported a bill amending the act to exclude public lands in Alabama from the operations of the laws relating to mineral lands.
