#### THE OHIO IDEA.

It is but a few years since Senator Sherman held up to an agonized world the terrible sufferings of Eliza Pinkston, and she was held as a sort of angel by Republicans until the fact was developed that she was one of the most depraved and degraded of her race and glass. That distinguished Senator is now busy in working up political capita, out of the riots at Danyillle, Va., and Copiah, Miss., and will make them go for al, they can be made to be worth in the approaching campaign. The outrage mill is one of the strongest hopes of the Republican party in the coming contest and they are well aware of the fact. To be of any value, however, the outrages must be perpetrated in the South, and must be of such a character that they may be ascribed to partisan motives; but the futile mind of Republican leaders can easily find pretexts to make political capital when a wrong has been darned near frozen!" "Oh, James, it's committed against the colored race, no matter what might have been the cause for which they were made to suffer. Senator Sherman has been one of the most conspicuous-it not the very leader-of those who have sought to make every difficulty between whites and colored in the South a political race conflict. To hear a difficulty between the races in the South has been a boon which has filled him with hope for the continued success of his party and inspired and encouraged his ambition for the highest position within the gift of the people. 
