IN CONGRESS YESTERDAY.

SENATE. WASHINGTON, April 22.—Mr. Blair, from the committee on Education and Labor, reported favorably a bill to create a commission to inquire into and report upon the material, industrial and intellectual progress made by the colored people of the United States since 1865.

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. Mr. Dingley, of Maine, asked unanimous consent for the present consideration of the bill authorizing the Secretary of the Treasury to invest lawful money deposited in the Treasury by National Banking associations for the retirement of their circulating notes.

At the conclusion of Mr. Herbert's remarks the committee rose. The House then went into Committee of the Whole on the pension appropriation bill, the pending amendment being that offered by Mr. Rosecrans, of Cal., transferring the duties of the pension agent to the pay department of the navy.
